Scott Issen, President and CEO of Future Founders

Scott Issen is an entrepreneur and Co-Founder & CEO of Future Founders, a non-profit that is building the nation's largest inclusive community of intentional young entrepreneurs and entrepreneurial-minded leaders. As one of the organization's founders, Scott created an unparalleled suite of entrepreneurship programs for youth aged 12 to 30-years-old. Future Founders, recognized locally and nationally for its impactful work, will celebrate a milestone in early 2025: surpassing 50,000 youth served. Moreover, the organization's national founders secured over \$400M in revenue, raised \$300M in capital, and created 2,000 jobs.

Previously, Scott was Managing Director at the Chicagoland Entrepreneurial Center, which now runs the 1871 tech incubator, and mentored high-growth entrepreneurs. Scott has 20+ years of experience in entrepreneurship, leadership, and nonprofits.

Scott is a member of Entrepreneurs' Organization and The Economic Club of Chicago, and a mentor for South by Southwest (SXSW). He graduated magna cum laude from Washington University in St. Louis and was named to the Crain's "40 Under 40" list. While at WashU, Scott was active in Delta Sigma Pi, holding many leadership positions including Senior VP, VP Professional Activities, and Treasurer.

Scott is actively engaged in the entrepreneurial community and is on a mission to empower the next generation of entrepreneurs and business leaders.
