# Seek Opportunity, Learn from Your Brothers

#### Dear Deltasigs,

As we celebrate the start of another academic year, thousands of students are embarking on the first steps of their fraternal and professional journey. The seemingly daunting twists and turns that come with college life provide excellent opportunities for personal and professional growth, as well as lasting relationships. The following is some advice on how to make the most of the Delta Sigma Pi experience. While directed primarily at our collegiate brothers, they should also resonate with alumni.

**Stretch yourself.** In college, you have the unique opportunity to take risks, fall short, do better the next time, and the next time after that. Take classes from that tough professor; go for that spot in a student organization; apply for that internship or study abroad, even if you do not speak the language.



Capture and share it. Your experience, however mundane in the moment, will inspire brothers for years to come.

**Live it up.** It is rare in life that you have access to such a wealth of people and experiences. If you are a sports fan, check out a theater production; if you are an art lover, go to a big game. Judge for yourself which establishment has the best (fill in the blank). Get off campus from time to time and explore the surrounding community. Find those nuggets that few of your peers take time to uncover.

**Leave positive impressions.** Every interaction influences people's perception not only of you, but also your family, school, Fraternity or other student organizations, and circle of friends. Make those moments matter.

**Give all you've got.** Tutor, volunteer, and donate whatever you can spare. Get your friends and brothers involved in something about which you feel passionate. Make service a priority.



**Connect with the Deltasig community.** Go to regional or national events. Reach out to neighboring chapters to collaborate, share ideas, split travel costs to a LEAD event, or simply enjoy brotherhood. Seek out brothers when you travel abroad. You never know when a connection will open a door to a career opportunity... or a spouse.

**Go low-tech.** Connect with real, live people. Years later, you will be amazed at how clearly you recall individual conversations with people that had an impact on you.

**Keep an open mind.** Live your values consistently and unapologetically, but be open to the fact that some of them will evolve over the years. Embrace those paradigm shifting moments, however uncomfortable they are at the time.

**Lead.** Find any excuse to practice leadership, whether or not you hold an official position. These experiences will be invaluable in life and your career.

Finally, nearly a quarter of a million of our alumni brothers can attest to the fact that college graduation is not the end of your best years. It is a springboard to all that life has to offer.

# Grand Chapter Actions:

## Four amendments were passed.

Updated bylaws are available online.

Bylaw Article II, Section 10; Article IV, Sections 5, 8 and 9; Article V, Section 3; and Article VI, Section 2 were amended to remove the Vice President-Organizational Development (VPOD) position from the Board. The OD committee will now be led by a national chair.

Bylaw Article II Section 18 was amended to make National Committee Chairs eligible for Golden Council.

Bylaw Article VII Section 5 was amended to make the requirements for recall of a Provincial Vice President consistent with that of other elected members of the Board of Directors.

Bylaw Article XV, Sections 5 and 6 were amended to remove the specific maximum and minimum levels for dues and fees changes, and in their place a maximum annual percentage increase of 10% or \$15, whichever is less, was implemented.



# Scholarship and Brotherhood Helps Kenyan Achieve

ore than 17 million children have lost one or both parents to AIDS, according to UNICEF. Francis Ogutu, *Loyola-Chicago*, is one of those 17 million, losing his parents at age five. Francis was not going to let this slow him down and took bold steps to help him achieve success. In 2013, he graduated with a B.B.A. in Economics and Information Systems and is now an intern at Silver Point Capital in Stamford, CT. His remarkable success is in large part due to his own will to succeed, which was fortified by those who found his perseverance inspiring.

Brother Ogutu is from Nairobi, Kenya, and in 2005 he began training to be a craftsman when his grandparents could no longer afford for him or his three sisters to attend high school. He then learned of St. Aloysius Gonzaga Secondary School, a Jesuit-model high school in Kenya, known as the "School of Hope" and the world's first high school for AIDS orphans. The school was co-founded in 2004 by Father Terry Charlton, Chaplain of St. Al's and Christian Life Community (CLC) Kenya.

Francis, knowing he could not afford to attend the school without scholarship, went to the school with his aunt to learn how to apply for admission and financial aid. The bold decision to part from his plans of becoming a craftsman paid off. When accepted, Francis excelled immediately and served as the student body president.

After graduation, Francis passed the nationwide standardized test to earn a government scholarship to a Kenyan university. However, high school graduates must wait a year before attending college so Francis did community service for St. Al's for six months.

During that time Father Charlton


asked Francis to accompany him to Chicago where he was giving the commencement speech at Loyola. While there, Ogutu was asked to share his experience at St. Al's with university president Father Michael Garazini. With nothing to lose because he already planned to attend college in Kenya, Francis asked Garazini if Lovola could offer him a scholarship to study business.

Francis' courage to ask paid off when he was granted a four-year scholarship of tuition, fees and health insurance. Unfortunately, room and board and other living expenses were not covered. Ann Marie and Pat Brennan, who met Francis during his trip to the U.S. in the spring of 2009, found his perseverance inspiring and wanted to offer additional assistance.

Ann Marie was the President of CLC USA and through a variety of fundraising efforts by the Brennans and CLC USA, Francis' additional expenses were covered while in school.

The Brennan's recall, "Francis came to the U.S. with little more than the clothes on his back and an incredibly strong desire to learn and work hard. He has truly excelled."

The assistance of others helped Francis succeed and focus on extracurricular activities including the International Student Club, African Student Alliance, Unified Student Government Association and Delta Sigma Pi. Francis remembers the smiles of Brothers Scott

Werner and Mary Roberts as welcoming and comforting. "I felt a sense of security, family, appreciation and care that I never received in the other organizations," according to Francis. "Delta Sigma Pi had changed my most lonely end of my first year at Loyola to a life of happiness and smiles."

Ultimately, Francis plans to return to Kenya to seek a position in economic planning and development with the government. And if Francis takes the same bold steps he took in his own life to achieve his goal of improving access to education and literacy rates in Kenya, then he will leave this world a better place as our four Founders had envisioned.





# Back to School Back to Studying

With the new school year now in full swing, many parents are looking for ways to help their son or daughter to succeed with their studies. With Common Core being implemented in K-12 across 46 states, Advanced Placements (AP) exams becoming more and more important for college admission, and the dreaded SAT continuing to be "THE" big test, it's important to remain focused on the basics. Good studying habits never go out of style. Here are some tips to share with sons, daughters, nephews, nieces, cousins and every other student in your life (perhaps even you!).

#### The "do" list:

#### Highlight.

Highlight your notes, textbooks, or flashcards to differentiate important facts while studying. Not only will this make it easier for you to reference quick facts, but just highlighting a piece of information will help your brain remember those important details.



Stay on track by working in hour-long blocks of time. Study for 45-50 minutes and then take a 10-minute break to keep your mind fresh. Walk around, check Facebook or Instagram (if allowed), or call a friend, but then get back to studying.

#### Have a review process.

Create a process for material review before a quiz or test. Are you visual? Does hearing material help? Writing it? Here is what the experts suggest:

- 1. Re-read your notes.
- 2. Rewrite notes, clarifying anything that is fuzzy.
- 3. Review highlighted information again.
- 4. Create flashcards for key concepts.
- 5. Make up examples to help you retain information.

#### Sleep.

We're serious. Sleep is important, not only right before test time. Sleeping at least 6-8 hours will help you study better and retain more information inside of the classroom.

#### The "don't" list:

The list of study "don'ts" is a long one, but our top 5 can make a big difference.

#### Don't listen to music.

A 2010 *Applied Cognitive Psychology* study found that listening to music while studying actually decreases your recall ability. Music can be great for energy and stress-relief, but use it *before* you hit the books or during your breaks.

#### Don't start with the easy stuff.

Tackle the most difficult material first, while your brain is fresh and you are at your best. When you are struggling, tired, or stressed, take a quick break and then switch over to less complicated subjects.

#### Don't multitask.

For best learning, focus your efforts on only one subject at a time. Don't jump back and forth between math and science or try to study while doing other things. A 2010 Indiana University study confirms it—each new task you add takes something away from the others and hinders your ability to understand and process information. "Multitasking is less than a good idea," said Charles Frederick, director of IU's Student Academic Center. "Research has shown that when you multitask you don't do things at a high level."

#### Don't just memorize information.

You need to understand and be able to apply the concepts you're learning. See if you can explain the information to a parent or friend. If you can teach it, then you know it.

David Pisoni, Chancellor's Professor of Psychology at Indiana University (and professor of a popular course on human

memory) says, "[when studying] think quality, not quantity. It's not how long you study, the number of hours you spend studying, it's what you do while you study. You'd be a lot better off studying one to two hours in an intelligent way than studying 10 hours rote memorization."

#### Don't only study alone.

Make friends with your classmates and study together; invite a friend over or meet at school after hours. If there are two of you, you can bounce questions off one another and help each other fill in gaps.

#### Find a tutor.

The best way to do well is always to find a high quality, inexpensive tutor. While it has traditionally been very tough to easily find a \$10-\$20/hr tutor, there's now a great solution to this problem. Tutor Matching Service is the *official* marketplace of universities, high schools, and other organizations across the USA. There's a rating system like Amazon reviews, and many tutors are even certified by your local university. The average price is just \$10/hr nation-wide, though it varies by geographic location. While most of the tutors are available for in-person tutoring (in-home, Starbucks, library, etc.), some are also available online (through Skype and the like). Of course, the tutor can also be you. The more time you can spend helping your son or daughter with their homework—even if it's just moral support—the better. Happy Studying! ▲

## Fraternity Board Meeting "Minutes in Seconds" (August 4 and 10, 2013)

GO

- With GCC removal of VPOD from Bylaws, references also removed from policies, replaced by OD Committee Chair. The VP-Finance will serve as a representative Foundation Trustee.
- Approved educational grant request from the Leadership Foundation for 2014-15 that represents a 15% grant increase (later approved by the Foundation Trustees).
- ▲ Approved IRS Set Aside Resolution for \$116,452 of "passive" income to be set aside for qualified educational purposes.
- ▲ Approved allowing ineligible late-paying chapters with balances to be eligible for GCC voting, if they paid with cash or credit card by August 7. (Several did so.)
- Approved extensive investment policy revision to address the changing financial arena and potential new investment vehicles.
- Approved policy to clarify the proper dissemination of Board agendas, budgets and recommendations to be considered.
- Discontinued the awarding of alumni chapter regional awards due to minimal applications.
- Will seek possible national service partnership with Ronald McDonald House during 2013-15 biennium.
- ▲ Approved a change to merchandise sales policy that prohibits merchandise promoting conduct in violation of risk management policies and also adds the PVP as an evaluator of such.
- ▲ Placed Iota Chi (*Illinois State*) on suspension until November 19, 2013 to comply with the University action of suspension for violations to the student code of conduct in regard to alcohol.
- Placed Gamma Pi (Loyola-Chicago) in reorganization until December 18, 2013 to further assist them with membership reconciliation while on University and Fraternity Probation for violations to Ritual and pledge education policies and the hazing section of the Risk Management, Insurance, and Conduct Policy.
- Placed Xi Omega (Florida International) on probation until August 2014 for operational deficiencies which failed to be improved with Guidance programs.
- After GCC approved National Committee Chair eligibility for the Golden Council, approved a policy setting four years of such service as the benchmark.
- ▲ Approved the budget for Fall 2014 LEAD Schools that includes minimal registration increases.
- ▲ Added an additional reporting deadline of January 31st for CMP accredited chapter level professional and community service activities conducted in the fall term. (Effective July 1, 2014.)
- Resolved to commend Central Office Communications Interns Logan Lucas and Elisa Frazier, both Miami-Ohio, for their great service to the Fraternity.
